**Obituary – Jon White, March 1937 to 5August 2018** 

Jon White was probably unique in the history of the 55+ Association as he was firstly the Delegate for Rotorua and after he and his wife, Jocelyn, moved to Otaki in 2009 was elected the Delegate for Kapiti after the then Kapiti Delegate resigned because of ill-health in 2010.

Jon lived his younger years in the Wairarapa. Jon amused himself by making canoes and trolleys by scrounging from the local engineering scrap yard any item that could be used for wheels that would roll along the footpath and other items that could be used in canoes that were sailed in the town creek that went through Jon's home.

Jon met his the future wife, Jocelyn Cooper, at a party at a friend's place and ended up taking Jocelyn home after the party, romance blossomed followed by Jon and Jocelyn getting married.

Jon became the Rotorua Delegate around 2009 and held that position until he and Jocelyn moved down to Otaki in late 2009. After becoming the Kapiti Delegate in 2010, Jon held the position until sometime in 2013, when his health was starting to deteriorate, which resulted in Jon spending some short periods in hospital. Never the less, Jon still bowled with the Kapiti Krocks league and in 2015 won the Kapiti Krocks Singles Championship. Then in 2016 he didn't bowl, but Jon and Jocelyn ran the Kapiti Krocks weekly raffle until Jon had to enter the Madison rest home in Levin later that year, which was where he passed away on 5 August 2018. Jocelyn used to go and see Jon every day, where she would feed him his mid-day meal.

Jon's funeral was held in Levin and was attended by family and friends, including tenpin bowlers.
